The Winston Churchill Foundation of the United States is pleased to announce the new cohort of 16 Churchill Scholars, including the one Kandars Churchill Scholarship in Science Policy, for the 2019-20 academic year.

The Churchill Scholarship and Kandars Churchill Scholarship are for one year of Master's study at Churchill College in the University of Cambridge. The awards cover full tuition, a stipend, travel costs, and the chance to apply for a \$2,000 special research grant. The Churchill Scholarship dates to 1963.

The Kandars Churchill Scholarship is awarded from a pool of applicants to the Cambridge Master's in Public Policy. For the 15 Churchill Scholarships in mathematics, science, and engineering, we received 105 nominations from 76 of our 114 Participating Institutions. The most popular department to which nominees applied, as it is most years, was mathematics, with 21 applicants. The next most popular department was engineering, with 20, followed by physics, with 10.
